

Citing a Brochure or Pamphlet

Description of sources (from NoodleTools)

- **Pamphlet:** A short (under 50 pages), unbound, nonperiodical publication.
- **Brochure:** Typically a folded (bifold, trifold) page or stapled booklet that may contain product information or promotional material.
- **Leaflet:** A flat or folded sheet of paper (handbill, flyer) distributed as an advertisement or notice.
- **Tract:** A short treatise in pamphlet form, usually on a religious or political subject.

General Guidelines:

Titles of source are in *italics*

Titles of articles within the larger source are in “quotation marks”

All punctuation should be followed by one space

Abbreviate the names of all months **except** May, June and July

Date format: Day Month (abbrev.) Year (ex: 19 Jan. 2016)

Double space and alphabetize citations

Author or Editor (last name, first name). *Title of Pamphlet*. Publisher, Date of Publication.

Note: For a pamphlet without an author, begin with the title of the pamphlet

“Denmark.” *Background Notes*. U.S. Department of State, June 2009.

“Insurance Claim Adjusters.” *Occupational Briefs*. Chronicle Guidance Publications, 2001.

“Islamic Republic of Afghanistan.” *CultureGrams: World Edition*. ProQuest CSA, 2009.

Sugar, Bert Randolph, editor. *Mecca 1911 Double-Folder Baseball Cards*. Dover, 1991.
