

Citing an Interview that was Published or Broadcast

General Guidelines:

As with all citations, some information may not be available, such as the name of the interviewer, or a title for the interview.

Interview - Broadcast

Format:

Interviewee's Last name, First name). "Title of Interview." Interview by Name of Interviewer.

Name of Program. Produced/Hosted/Narrated etc. by Names of People Involved, Name of Broadcaster, Publication Date. Medium of publication.

Example:

Dickinson, Terri. "Words with Friends." Interview by Johnna Christnesen. *Famous Librarians Speak Out*, produced by Fred Smith, hosted by Shelly Kanton, HBO, 6 Oct. 2015. Transcript.

Interview – In Print

Format:

Interviewee's Last name, First name. "Title of Interview." Interview by Name of Interviewer.

Name of Publication. Edited/Translated/Etc. by Names, Publisher, Publication Date, page numbers.

Examples:

Hawking, Stephen. "Expansion of Time." Interview by Julianna Colberg. *Travels Through Time: Scientists Discuss Changing Concepts of Time*, edited by Jessica Fletcher, Martingale, 2016, pp. 32-78.

Baracott, Bruce. "Information Literacy in a Digital Age." Interview by Carrie Stroup. *Seattle Times*, May 28, 2015, pp. A7-A8.

Interview – Published Online-only

Format:

Person interviewed Last name, First name. "Title of Interview." Interview by Name of

Interviewer. *Name of Website*, uploaded by Name of person, Name of Website Publisher,

URL. Accessed Date. Interview

Example:

Bray, Libba. "A Video Interview With Libba Bray." *AdLit.org*, uploaded by Emily Post, WETA,

2016, www.adlit.org/authors/Bray/24500/. Accessed 12 Dec. 2016. Interview.
