

Citing an Article from Culture Grams

Culture Grams has a **CITATION GENERATOR** that will make your MLA citation for you. Directions for using it are below the manual formatting directions.

Format:

“Title of Entry.” *CultureGrams* (include which edition). ProQuest, Current Year. Web. Date of Access.

Examples:

“Peru.” *CultureGrams World Edition*. ProQuest, 2016. Web. 19 May 2014.

General Guidelines: (These include common editing that is needed in the Citation Generator)

Capitalize all important words in the title, even if not capitalized in original

Titles of articles are in “quotation marks”

Titles of database is in *italics*

Periods are used to separate major sections in each entry

(“Article.” *Title*. Publication info. Web. Date of access.)

All punctuation should be followed by one space

Date format: Day Month (abbrev.) Year (ex: 19 Jan. 2016)

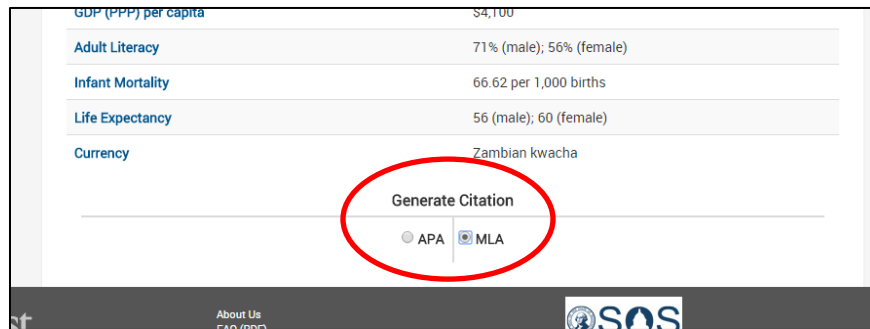
Abbreviate the names of all months **except** May, June and July

Double space and alphabetize citations

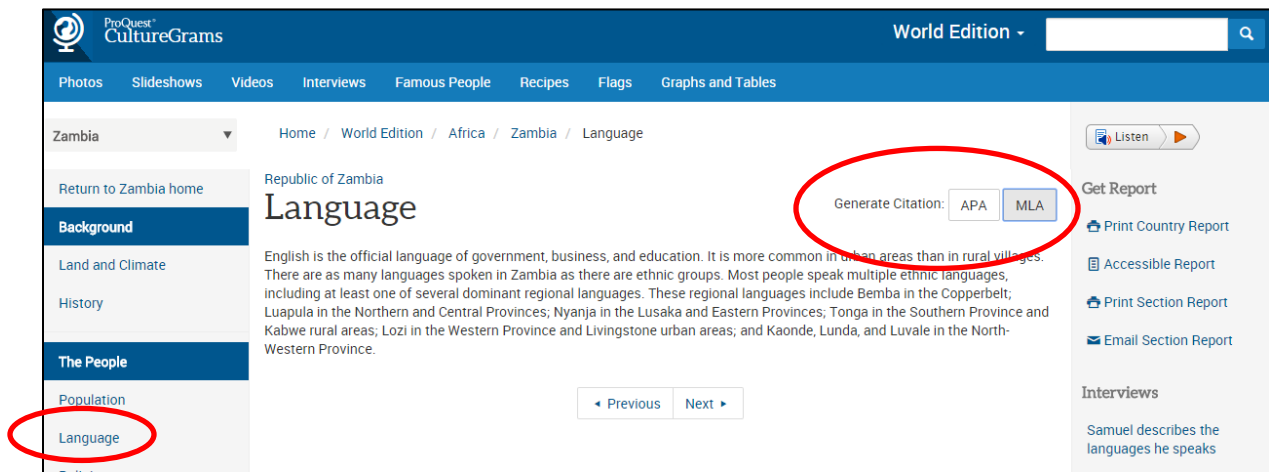
Using the Citation Generator

To get a citation for an entire country article, scroll to the bottom of the country's main page. Choose MLA and click "Generate Citation." Use this option if you use information from more than one section of the country article.



Copy and paste citation that appears.

To get a citation for a section within a larger article, click on the topic in the side menu, and then click on "Generate Citation" on the top right of the article.



Copy and paste citation that appears.

Be sure that the copied citation is in 12 pt. Times New Roman font with a hanging indent.
